The last thing I bought and loved was a 1950s Milanese rosewood and brass desk [pictured] with an asymmetrical kidney-shaped glass surface and clever drawers and shelves at the back. And the thing I'm eyeing next is a bespoke chandelier by glass artist Michael Ruh, who makes my new perfume bottles. He handcrafts beautifully simple shapes in exquisitely nuanced colours inspired by natural light and shade, which is the kind of palette I love. The last meal that truly impressed me was a paella at Cigala in London. Chef Jake Hodges makes it to perfection – moist yet light, and delicately spiced. It's happy food that's good for sharing. In my fridge you'll always find strawberries, San Pellegrino, and smoked salmon from Norwegian smokehouse Hansen & Lydersen, which has a smoky but subtle taste. An indulgence I would never forgo is my early-morning walk on Primrose Hill with my border terrier Pop. People are amazed I've got a dog with my nose, but he's a little friend for my son Henri, as well as for me. Our walks declutter my mind and kickstart ideas.

The best gift I've received recently is a beautifully simple, Solange Azagury-Partridge skinny diamond eternity ring [pictured], from Christophe. It was a Valentine's gift but I suspect it was also to celebrate my new journey as Perfumer H. 5 Carlos Place, London W1 (020-7792 0197; www.solange.co.uk).

An object I would never part with is the screwdriver [pictured] my grandfather used to make furniture. The carved wooden handle puts me back in touch with him, his workshop, its sounds and smells. He was a great inspiration.
